1. CALL TO ORDER: Mr. Stewart, Chair, called the meeting to order at $6: 05$ p.m.

2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Ms. Silvers moved, seconded by Ms. Lartigue, to approve the minutes of meeting \#1519 of January 19, 2017. Charles Flynn abstained, all others Yes, Motion Passes.

## 3. COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE AUDIENCE PERTAINING TO THIS EVENING'S AGENDA ITEMS

A. Student Representative Report: Caitlin Herrick and Mary Shallaby spoke to the School Committee. The Junior Class is holding fundraisers and planning for the prom, which this year will be at Cranwell. The seniors are working on a budget and planning their senior class trip. The freshman class is also working on fundraising, there will be a bake sale at Expo Night. The classes have met to brainstorm on what they feel is needed in the next superintendent.

The School Committee thanked Caitlin and Mary for coming to the school committee meeting.

## 5. UPDATE(S)/PRESENTATION(S):

A. Superintendent Finalists - Jennifer Dowley

Ms. Silvers introduced Jennifer Dowley, the consultant in our Superintendent search.
Ms. Dowley commended the Screening Committee (Charlie Ketchen, Bruce Turner, Tom Ryan, Jane Burke, Stephen Leining, Christina Carlson, Neil Barbieri, Karen Frighetto, Fiona Kerr, James Theriot,

Glenn Devoti, Mary Turo, Francoise Lartigue) on their hard work and commitment during the interview process. She also acknowledged David Hastings, Jeremy Wells, Chris Thompson and Lynette Gagnon for their help with various tasks during the screening and interview process. Ms. Dowley further gave a shout out to Glenn Koocher from MASC who coached Ms Silvers and her through the whole process.

Ms. Dowley further explained that the district had received 21 applications from all across the state and country. Of those 21 applicants, the Superintendent Screening Committee selected 9 semi-finalists. Each interview lasted an hour and 15 minutes. The Superintendent Screening Committee was charged to bring forward 2 to 5 candidates as finalists, they selected 3 finalists. Ms. Dowley has spoken with each of the three candidates, they are:

- Mary Jane Rickson, Assistant Superintendent-Director/Principal Pathfinder Regional School District, Palmer, MA
- Beth Regulbuto, Associate Superintendent Hampden-Wilbraham Regional School District, Wilbraham, MA
- Michael Buoniconti, Mohawk Regional School District Mr. Buoniconti has agreed to put his application forward but under the condition that he begin a conversation about a shared superintendency.

Ms. Dowley will now begin to turn over the process of interviewing the finalists to the Executive Evaluation Subcommittee. She has worked with the EEC to develop questions for the finalist interviews. Site visits to the candidates' districts will be planned for February 13, 14, 17 and 27.
Mr. Stewart thanked Ms. Dowley and the screening committee for their dedication and hard work.

## 5. BUSINESS

A. Request for Approval of Overnight Field Trips:

Jesse carpenter explained the Grade 8 trip to Washington. He also explained that grades 10 and 12 accompany them to Washington because it sustains the trip financially.
Mr. Flynn moved, seconded by Ms. Lartigue, to approve the Grades 8, 9 and 10 trip to Washington DC, from March 8 through 10, 2017. It was so voted unanimously.
Discussion ensued.
Mr. Stewart would like to know if there were any students who could not go because of financial constraints. Mr. Carpenter assured the committee that no one was denied because of a lack of finances.
B. Lateral Move on the Unit A Salary Schedule effective February 1, 2017

Mr. Flynn moved, seconded by Mr. Batacchi, to approve the lateral move of Kelly MacDonald from M to M9 effective February 1, 2017. It was so voted unanimously.
C. Tentative Adoption of the Fy'18 Operating, Transportation, and Capital Budgets - Superintendent Hastings, Business Manager Chris regan, Chair Finance Committee Dennis Sears

Chris Regan, Business Manager, presented the budget. She looked at history back to 2013 to see for trends. Some adjustments were made because of changes in salaries and positions. Governor's budget came out on the $25^{\text {th }}$, and the DESE does the calculations to determine minimum contributions for each of the towns. Ms. Regan explained that the district went out on a joint transportation bid with Berkshire Hills Regional School District. There was only one bidder, Massini Bus Co. The bids came in on Tuesday and were much higher than anticipated. Assessments are based on the transportation bid as it came in. She is confident that we will be able to reduce the number of routes and thereby cut costs and the assessments will change. Ms. Regan further explained the transportation bid. There was a $61 \%$ increase in the rates for next year. She explained that the current rates were based on 2012. The current
bid is higher, but is in the vicinity of what other districts are paying for rates. Massini Bus Co. are subcontracting with Greg Massini and Dufour Bus Co.

Ms. Lartigue moved, seconded by David Travis, that the district award the bid to Massini Bus Co.
Discussion ensued.
David Travis brought up concerns on childcare, of where children will be dropped off, and to make afternoon activities a priority.

Ms. Lartigue asked to call the question.
Mr. Flynn-No; Ms. Lartigue -Yes; David Travis-Yes; Ms. Silvers-Yes; Ms. Bush-Yes; Mr. Sears-Yes; Mr. Law No. Motion passes 5-2

Ms. Bush left the meeting at 8:00 p.m.
The Finance Subcommittee had requested that Ms. Regan to reorganize the budget in a different format, based on the programs. Not a lot of significant changes. Ms. Regan explained the breakdown of the budget and the change in insurance rates. BHG changed from Value Plus to deductible plans, for this year the premiums will not change. Ms. Regan continued to explain that the numbers for incoming school choice were higher than outgoing. The district is seeing a nice gain in the money coming in to offset some of the costs. For FY18 she was able to apply $\$ 900,000$ from school choice fund to cover salaries.
Chris explained the capital expense budget. Waiting on the BG\&T to approve the list of projects. We are required because of the work done on the boiler and roof project to keep enough money to maintain the buildings and equipment.

Mr. Flynn moved, seconded by Ms. Lartigue, to adopt the FY'18 preliminary budget as presented. Roll Call Vote:

Paul Menin, former Middle School Teacher and Wrestling Coach, also plays an important role in the program.
